

EMBRACING TESTING IN PREPARATION FOR GO LIVE

We are in the process of wrapping up activities to better prepare ourselves for Trenton Early Deployment (TED) go live. The project team is working with us to work out the kinks on the front end.

User Acceptance Testing (UAT)

In UAT, Super Users, Packaging, Quality, Material Services and Distribution leaders saw every delta MillerCoors Manufacturing Solution (MCMS) transaction happen live (which includes the differences from the Golden MCMS deployment) and identified 28 items that need to be adjusted. Completing UAT is an important step towards our March 19 go live in kegs, the first area to launch TED.



Factory Acceptance Testing

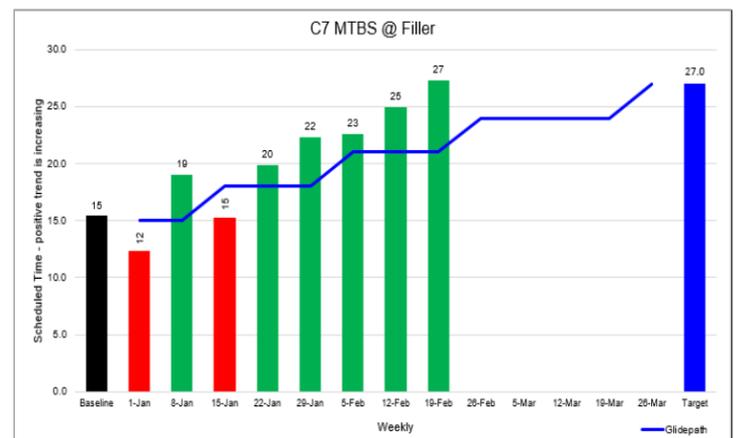
Resources within the Brewing and IT departments are working on Factory Acceptance Testing for Brewing's parallel deployment. This testing takes a closer look at the different integration points between our underlying process control software and MCMS, including quality instrumentation. They are reviewing the process, step by step, starting in the Brewhouse through Package Release.

WORLD CLASS SUPPLY CHAIN 2.0 WORK SHOWING GREAT RESULTS

At this week's "Better Together" plant conference, attendees had the opportunity to learn more about World Class Supply Chain 2.0 and the efforts of C7 and Distribution. Shop Chairman John Holub kicked off the WCSC 2.0 session by sharing the importance of engaging in the work and his appreciation of those who have led the way for us. A video was shown that captured key pieces of the tools within WCSC 2.0 for awareness for the entire brewery. Plant Manager Denise Quinn demonstrated how the work aligns to The Brewhouse, employee council structure and our Compelling Business Need (CBN).



Examples of results can be seen on both C7 and in Distribution. C7 is tracking Mean Time Between Stops (MTBS) at the filler which can be seen on the chart at the right. They have shown consistent improvement in their MTBS over the last five weeks! Distribution expanded their Fast Start to C2 last week. Only one week into the work, MTBS improved to 952 minutes from a baseline of 602! Great work, teams!



Speaking of metrics, a new Molson Coors Excellence Program will help us drive towards world class performance and deliver on our goal of being First Choice for our Customers and Consumers. As part of this program, we'll be measured and compared to the other breweries in Molson Coors in metrics directly linked to our WCSC 2.0 efforts.
